A Note from the Principal

As the end of the school year approaches, the middle school is an exciting place to work. The energy level of the students rises as they anticipate the coming summer. The teachers and staff eagerly begin coordinating the end of the year activities to bring about the close of another successful year. While all of this is happening, the administration and staff are also busy preparing for next year. The process of scheduling students at Geneva Middle School South is a complicated one. This process begins in the middle of January and continues into the summer. Throughout this time period, there are numerous processes and deadlines that need to be met in order to provide the students with schedules before the first day of school. Some of these processes and deadlines apply to parents as much as to the teachers and staff. It is for this reason I am informing the parents about the scheduling process.

The first step in the process occurred back in February and March when each parent sent in a form regarding their student's elective decisions. I am happy to say you all have accomplished this task and I appreciate your help.

You were mailed a letter that lists the courses your child will be enrolled in for the 2015-2016 school year. It shows their elective choices as well as the math and language arts levels of your student. It is important that the information is reviewed to make sure it is accurate. If it is not accurate, please call the school office to let us know about any changes you believe are necessary. If the information is accurate, but you wish to make a change, then please send me a letter requesting the appropriate change. In order to keep our deadlines, it is important that all corrections or changes are made prior to Tuesday, June 2, 2015.

June 2nd is an important deadline for another step in the process. By June 2nd, all special requests related to your student's schedule should be made in writing. It is important to note that although we do not encourage special requests, we do understand that it is sometimes necessary. A perfect example of a reasonable special request is when a parent has a set of twins and either wants them placed on the same team or separate teams. Another example of a special request may be asking for your student to be separated from another student that they have had consistent problems with throughout the past school year. Generally speaking we do not encourage requests for students to be placed on a same team unless there are exceptional circumstances. This being said, please send all special requests in writing to me by Tuesday, June 2, 2015 so we can do our best to honor these requests.

The final step in this process occurs in the fall when the schedules are mailed home. When this occurs, there are a few things that need to happen. The first is to verify the accuracy of the schedule to make sure the math and language arts placements are accurate as well as the elective choices. You may want to avoid using the phone that day because every middle school student in Geneva will be busy calling the students they attended elementary school with to see what teams they were placed on! It is important to understand there are no changes to team assignments once schedules are mailed. Finally, remind your student that one of the best things about Geneva Middle School South is the opportunity to meet new friends from the other elementary schools while maintaining old friendships at the same time.

As much as I look forward to the wonderful activities that occur at the end of the year, I also look forward to the opportunity to meet the new students coming to us in the fall. Thank you for the support you provide your students throughout the school year and thank you for the help you provide us during our scheduling process.




FROM THE NURSE'S DESK

Session 1: June 8-June 25 (Mon thru Thurs)

Session 2: July 13-July 30 (Mon thru Thurs)

Program Descriptions

Introduction to Computer Programming (Middle School)

Audience: Students entering grades 6-8

Offered: Session 2 only from 8:00-11:00 AM Tuition: \$135

Description: Now that computers are prevalent in society today, it has become important to understand how and why computer

software is created. This course is designed to give students an edge in logical thought, and provide practical applications into how to solve complex problems in any field with the help of computer programming. Students will begin to understand how to take problems without clear solutions and break them down into manageable pieces. They will learn problem solving skills that they can take with them to other applications outside of programming. By the end of this course, students will be able to write simple programs and be able to understand various pre-written

codes.

Algebra Bridge

Audience: Students entering grades 9-12 who will be taking Algebra I or Algebra IA in the fall

Offered: Session 2 only from 8:00-11:00 AM Tuition: \$100

Description: This course is designed for students who may need a refresher or additional practice in order for them to be the most

successful in their Algebra I or Algebra IA course. The focus of the program will be reinforcement of concepts including integers/fractions, operations, solving one and two step equations, proportions, percents, as well as some

geometry concepts. This program will require limited work outside of the official class times.

Typing/Computer Keyboarding

Audience: Students entering grades 6-12 who wish to improve their typing/keyboarding skills


Offered: Session 1 only from 8:30-10:30 AM Tuition: \$65

Description: With the use of computers in homes, schools, and workplaces, it is very important that students have the ability to

type effectively. Participants in this program will work to develop efficient and effective typing/keyboarding skills as they work on their typing speed and accuracy using the touch typing technique. Participants will also spend time getting more familiar with typing in word processing software (Microsoft Word). Students able to type 30 words

per minute will be able to meet the proficiency for the Computer Software Applications course at GHS.
