A speaker read a letter from another person, a co-worker, who was unable to attend tonight's meeting to speak on behalf of the GSSA. I have worked for the district since 1994. In 2006, I retired from teaching Spanish. Due to an unforeseen life event, I have had to return to the work force. Because the support staff formed a union, we were informed that we would not get a pay raise until we had a contract. We were hopeful that a settlement would be quick coming, as we were only asking to be treated fairly. Months have passed and there is still no contract or pay raise. The lack of a pay increase has affected me adversely. My IMRF will be reduced unless a settlement is reached. It is disheartening that the same administrators that asked the support staff to step up when the teachers strike seemed imminent are now showing disregard to our contributions to the education of the students in District 304. Geneva has a reputation for excellence in education, which is in great part due to the dedication of the support staff. Again, do what is right and negotiate a contract with us.

#### 5. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT (Policy 1210)

The Superintendent reported that there are many upcoming activities such as the Fine Arts Show, Prom, many concerts and athletic events, as well as senior activities. We encourage you to stay informed through 304 Connects and the district website. There are also many things happening in assessment. During principal meetings today, we talked about using the data from the ACT's and how that data might fit with the longitudinal data of the new SAT's. In addition, we are looking at data as part of the evaluation process for teachers. This summer, we will try to reformat and use the data in a manner that helps to inform instruction so that we can continuously improve on our work with our students.
