Elementary Criteria

Community Unit School District 304's Elementary Acceleration/Enrichment Program offers enrichment and extension opportunities for elementary students. This program also supports elementary classroom and A/E educators throughout the school year with advanced materials and other enrichment/extension activities.

ELEMENTARY A/E REPLACEMENT PROGRAM: Students in grades four and five who are identified for A/E replacement services in reading and/or in math meet with their building A/E teacher for daily instruction in these content areas. The A/E Program is taught by trained teachers. The curriculum used in the A/E Program parallels the curriculum used in grades four and five but accelerates and/or extends the curriculum as students demonstrate instructional competency. Once elementary students are identified for the A/E Program, they often remain in the program until re-identification occurs as they enter middle school. Although there is no formal A/E identification for students in the primary grades (K-3), the District's A/E teachers support the classroom teachers as they meet the instructional needs of each of their students.
