## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome to the 2019-2020 school year! We are excited to have the Freshman Class of 2023 join us. They appear to be a great addition to our student body and I would encourage the Senior Class of 2020 to enjoy every moment of this exciting year.

Thank you to all of you who attended our annual "Back-to School Night." If you were unable to take advantage of the Junior Planning presentation or the Senior Financial Aid, Scholarships and College Application Process presentations offered by our Counseling & Advising department that night, they are posted on the Counseling & Advising page on the GHS website.

Things are going to get busy here at GHS very quickly. Please come out and see a new event, the Freshman Play – James and The Giant Peach on Friday or Saturday, September 20th or 21st. Elsewhere in this Viking Vessel you will find information about our upcoming Homecoming Week, which takes place September 22-28. Please pay careful attention to all the important dates and times.

Our PLC Thursdays began on the second day of the school year and will continue every
Thursday. There are many important meetings that take place during that time. Please be aware that our mandatory meetings for an entire class are not optional. Unless your child is



ill or has an appointment that cannot be avoided, they are expected to be in attendance. We use these meetings to share a wide variety of important topics. Thank you for your cooperation and support.

While it's early in the semester we ask that you please be reminded that our first semester final assessments will take place before the holiday break on Wednesday, December 18th, Thursday, December 19th, and Friday, December 20th. These assessments are an extremely important part of the semester grade so we encourage you to avoid making travel plans until after the 20th.

## GHS Personal Learning Choices (PLC) on Thursdays

## First Semester: August thru December 2019

Every Thursday will begin with a PLC period, which stands for Personal Learning Choices. This period will begin at 7:40 and will last until 8:20. Buses will run on the same schedule as they normally do. First hour will then begin at 8:30 with slightly shortened periods for the remainder of the day. The school day will still conclude at 2:45.

During the PLC period, a variety of opportunities will exist for students to enrich their learning, collaborate with their peers, receive extra help on assignments in various tutoring centers, and participate in different activities. In addition to these choices, there will be some required sessions for specific groups and grade levels held during the PLC time. Attendance will be taken at these mandatory sessions and consequences will be issued for unexcused absences. The dates of these required sessions as well as additional information are included below.






